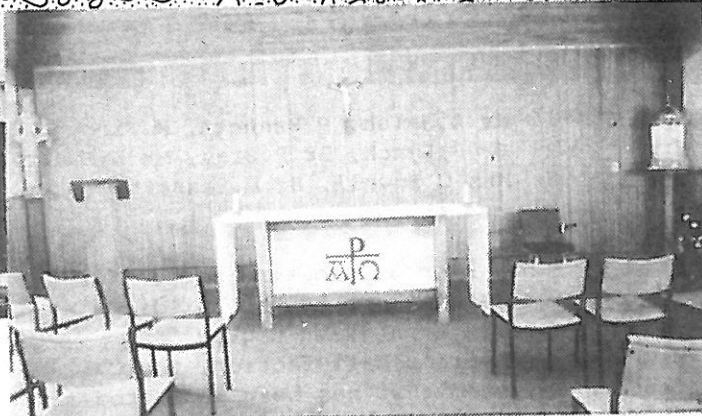
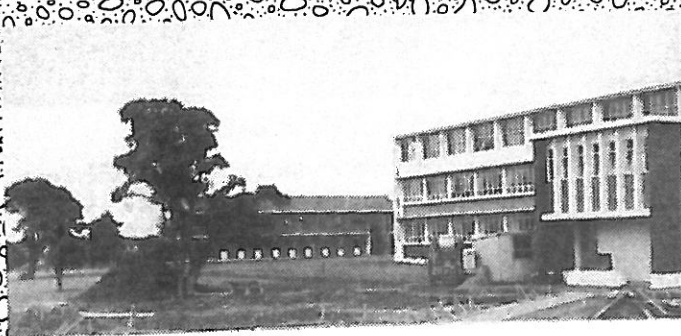
PRINCIPAL'S COMMENT

This is the last time comments will be written for the magazine with Francis Douglas College an independent college. By this time next year the College will be integrated and operating under rather different terms.

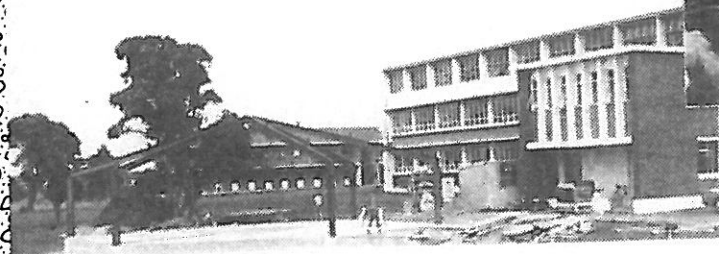
It is well to reflect on the past thirty-five years to see the way the College has developed. This development has been characterized by a constant struggle. From 1946 when the first meeting to begin fundraising was held through until the present, there has been a financial struggle to provide what was necessary. The obstacles have always been confronted and overcome but not without considerable effort and in some cases anguish. In many ways this struggle has done much to weld the people associated with the College together and we have much to be

thankful for and proud of when we look at the way the College has been supported. This struggle has however, also forced us to relinquish some of the independence we have enjoyed in order to remain in existence. We are about to enter into unknown waters as an integrated college. Some of what I see excites me in terms of the possibilities we can work towards. There are other things, however, of which I am somewhat wary. I hope the financial struggle to survive was not the only thing that united people at the college so that with this now reduced we lose our sense of unity. We are a Catholic College and that should always be the unifying force.



It is important for us to be aware of the fact that we are part of the Church, that we are seeking to entice people into a relationship with Christ and to do what we can to build up the Body of Christ. We are not an entity in ourselves, completely independent of other agencies in the Church. Hence we need to be conscious of and sensitive to what is happening in the families, the parish, the diocese and the Church at large and to do our part as a school to bring God to man and man to God.

We are fortunate that many of the parishes from which the boys come have been involved in parish renewal programmes and several of our staff have also been active in these. This is a source of great hope and I feel excited by the possibilities of parents, parish and college working together to understand what it means to be Catholic and what the Lord is asking of us all.

It is only when this happens and young people see the value and worth of being Catholic together that they will be enticed to give of themselves in the Church. Those of us who are adults must be able to answer the questions of young people regarding the value of being a Catholic with our lives as well as with our words. They must see that for us being a Catholic is something important and precious and not a burden we carry, otherwise we will never entice them to investigate and give of themselves in a wholehearted relationship with Christ.

As a College we must seek to work more closely with parents and parish to ensure that our Catholic character is preserved and enhanced. While we seek after excellence in all spheres of activity we are not interested in becoming a better state school than the ones we have in the city. Parents need to be aware of this when they decide to apply to send their boys here. The reason we exist is because we are seeking to be different and different in a Catholic way. If parents send their sons here or take them away from the College simply on the basis of an academic standard then I feel we have missed the point of why we exist.

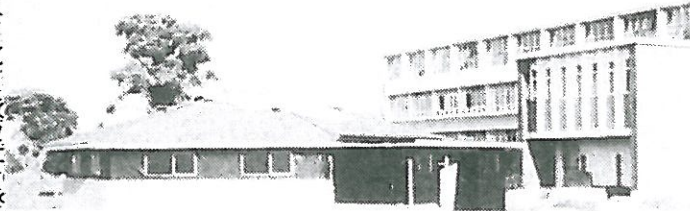
I believe there are many things in the College which give us great cause for hope that what we are striving for is worthwhile and is being achieved. The opening of our new chapel this year was important because in it we had the



dedication of a beautiful frame around an empty space, highlighting the presence of Him who is still the centre of all human life. Our other buildings will be ready early next year and they will be very welcome, but we must be careful not to fall into the trap of thinking that good facilities make a good school. We will be very fortunate once we have those facilities but we will still have to work at developing our Catholic character.

As we come to the end of an era for the College we must thank all those people who worked so hard to establish and sustain the College and to God who has blessed us so abundantly. As we move into a new era and step out on the water we must do so with great confidence in the presence and love of our Father and be prepared to turn to Him. If we do this and are all prepared to be open to Him, then as families, college, parish and diocese we will be able to achieve great things and the Lord will be able to work among us. This Lord "who is able to do so much more than we can ever ask for, or even think of, by means of the power working in us."

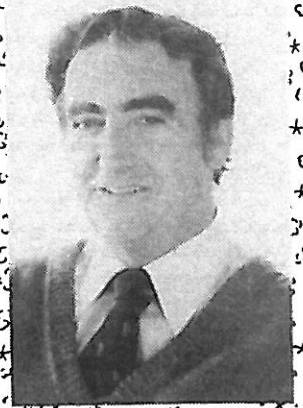

BASKETBALL REPORT

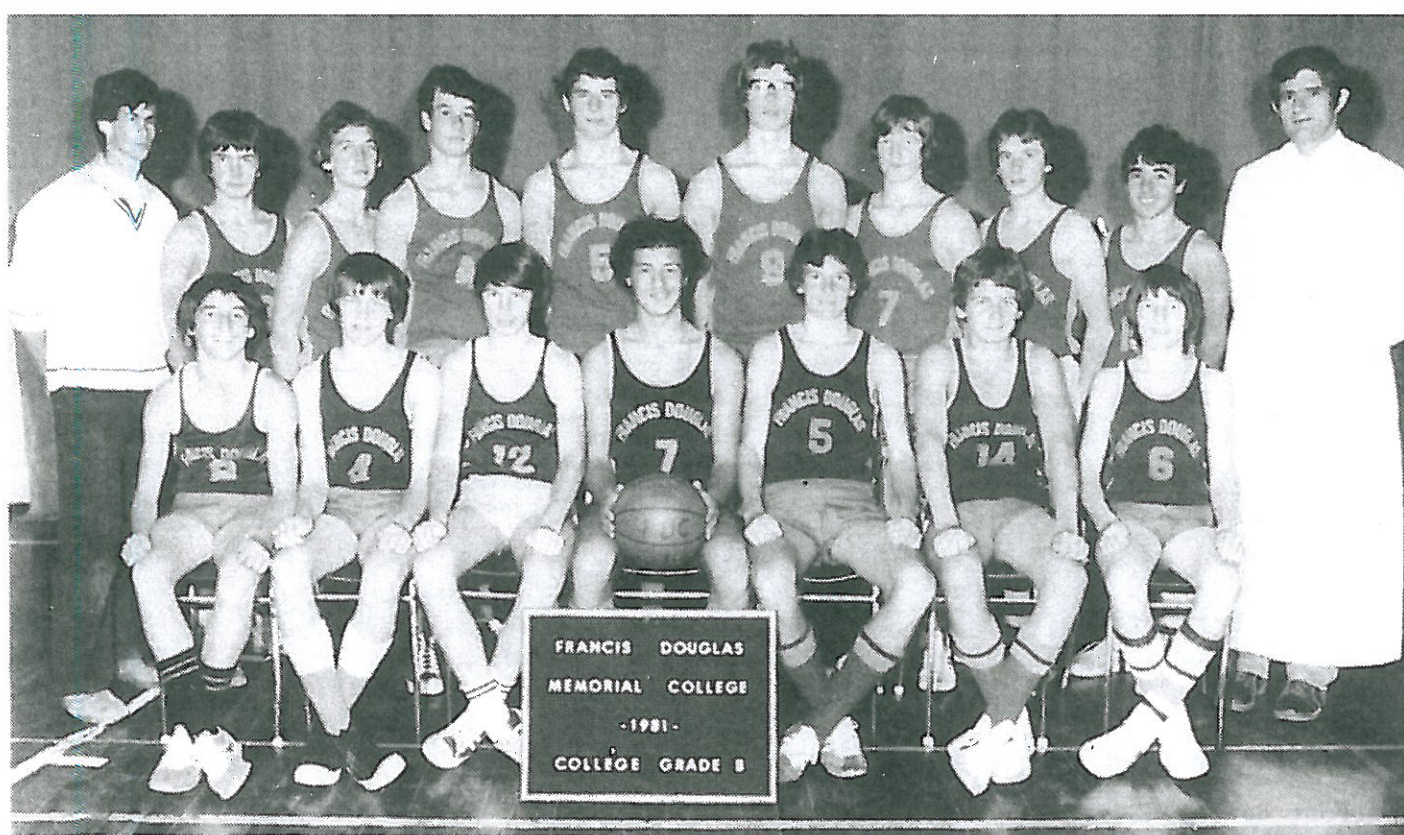

SOCIAL TEAM

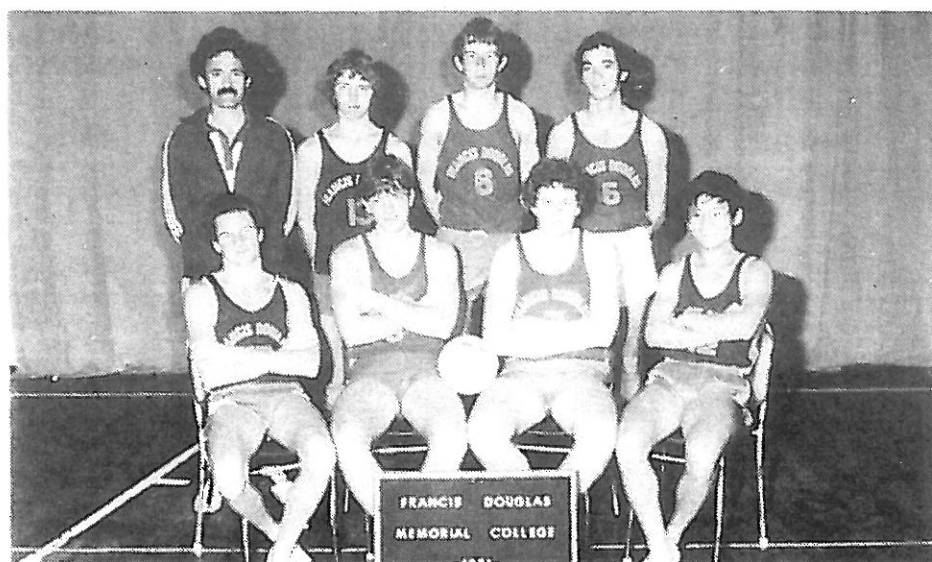

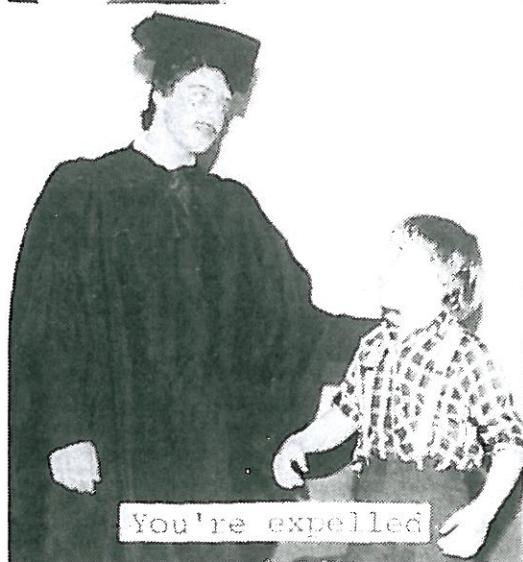

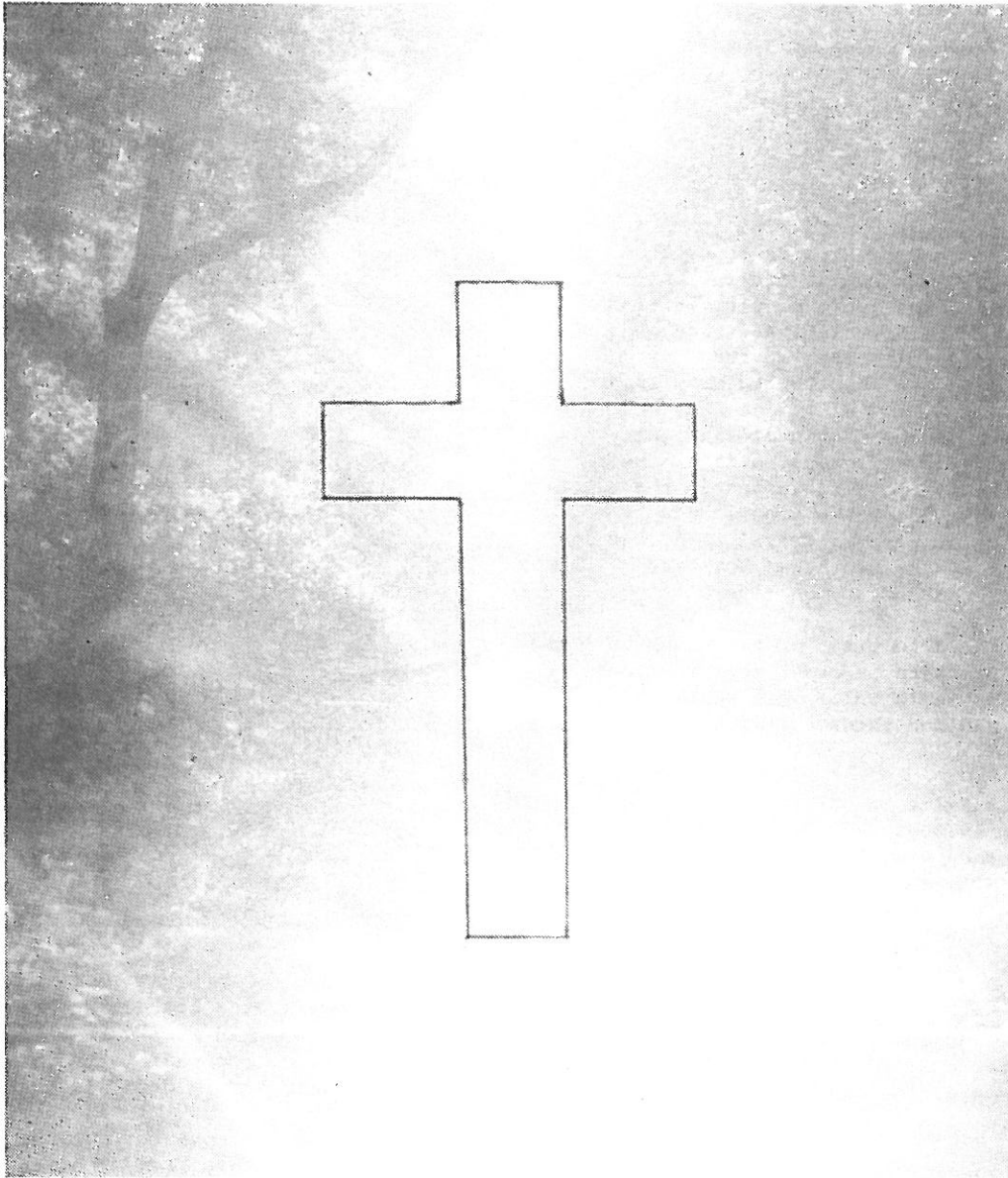


STEPHEN HOGAN
