BOARD OF GOVERNORS

The year 1986 has been an eventful one for the Board in that there have been many situations around that have been clouding normal routine business. Firstly, at the start of the year there was a problem in recruiting teachers and the general uncertainty caused by the salary review for teachers. Secondly, there was cloud over the future of Catholic schools caused by the money problem due to the cost of integration. Thirdly, the curriculum review process was taking place, which will have a significant effect on the shape of education for the future.

All members of the school community have participated in the curriculum review process and draft recommendations are currently being considered. The welcome news that Government will assist in meeting the cost of integration, has removed a lot of the uncertainty, but the Catholic school system is still left facing a massive debt to service and although the moves announced will alleviate the situation, there will be an ongoing need for sacrifice by Catholic parents to meet the debt already incurred. Hopefully the shortage of teachers will soon be a thing of the past, but it has been a difficult year in this regard, especially on the Principal, Brother Peter.

The Board would like to thank the Principal and his staff for their continued efforts on behalf of the pupils at Francis Douglas College. Without in any way trying to single out any one teacher, it would be inappropriate if Brother Declan's departure from the school was not mentioned. Brother Dec's contributions to the school life over a long period of time has been much appreciated by the boys' parents and staff members. The Board trusts that on his return to his native shores, that he will carry with him fond memories of New Zealand and wishes him well in his future endeavours.

PRINCIPAL'S COMMENTS

In the course of this year, there have been some substantial changes in the way we are doing things here at Francis Douglas College. Some of these have been good and lead to an improvement in the deal that the boys are getting. Others have not been so successful and need to be revised substantially. In all this we must be clear about what we are seeking to do. It is so easy to become caught up in a mindless series of changes which are kneejerk responses to particular occurrences. What must be done, is for us to stand back and reflect on what is happening and then with some firm bedrock from which to work, make decisions about the future direction.

For us as a Catholic college, this bedrock must be the Good News which Jesus brought. We must be able to stand back and ask ourselves whether what is being proposed is going to enable people here to experience the Good News. If it is, then we should be prepared to try it. If it is not, then we shouldn't have anything to do with it.

The Good News is something we are continually growing to understand and appreciate. In essence, it is that we are precious and deeply loved by God. We can grow to know what that really means. It is through Jesus that we can come to understand it. He was a man who knew this world of ours. He was definite in his stand and lived by definite values. When we look at our lives we may discover that we give up the struggle for freedom, he did not. We may bow to the opinions of others, he did not. We may pursue short-cuts to happiness - he did not.

The response to him was mixed. Some made fun of him, or planned to kill him or moved away because he demanded too much. Some, however, did follow him and from these the Church began. It has been his word and his life that have remained at the centre of this group and touched lives and hearts down through the ages. His love did release men

and women and opened for them the way to freedom and it still does. He told us then to give our lives in service of others. He showed in his life what that meant in his time. The challenge is for us to find what it means in ours. At the heart of his life was a gentle and familiar relationship with his Father and it is this experience which is still at the heart of the Church today.

Jesus taught us to find God, not by following 'the Law', not by clinging to a 'religious' routine, not by striving for philosophical clarification, but by serving other people. We come to know God, the way we come to know other people - by loving them. We need to remember that God is at home in everyone, at home in everything. Nothing can separate us from him.

We can come to the freedom which allows us to realise this through a life-long process. Our lives are necessarily interwoven and we influence each other as we develop a culture. In this college, what we are seeking to do is develop an environment which will be rich and loving, where people can grow in freedom. This is basically what education is about. On the level of experience people need to be attentive to what they see and feel and so to be encouraged in observing and being sensitive. Hence the college is opposed to any moves which deprive people of such experiences. Jesus was seeking to awaken the experience of wonder and mystery in order to see to the heart of reality.

On the level of understanding, people need to be encouraged to grow in insight and see the significance of what they experience in the context of God's love. On the level of judgement people need to be encouraged to discern what is more important from what is less, what is more beautiful from what is less. On the level of decision-making people need to be encouraged to make real in their lives the values they profess. This means to be taught to be responsible. What we need is to create an environment where it is possible for people to experience this encouragement.

Where does that backdrop fit into our college? We need to ask whether what is going on here is enabling that to be a reality. We need to ask whether people involved in the college experience the freedom which Jesus brought to people, whether they experience the love he brought, whether they experience the peace he brought. If this is not the experience of people here, then we need to ask some serious questions about what is happening. We cannot work miracles here. The response of students is vital and the background out of which students come has a profound impact on the way they respond. It is, therefore, only in partnership that we can move towards something better.

I find it difficult to reconcile some aspects in which we are involved, with the direction in which we are headed. I find the way a sizeable proportion of young people are devastated by the present assessment system, difficult to reconcile. I see students losing confidence in themselves and time and again being reinforced with the idea of being failures, of being of little value, of being useless. If schools are supposed to enable students to develop as people and realise how precious they are, then what is happening in schools as present leaves much to be desired. I am convinced that there must be a better way for young people to spend such a crucial part of their lives.

I believe there is a real need to grasp the opportunity that is provided with the review of the curriculum and assessment and to turn it to the advantage of young people. We need to encourage people to meet and interact as whole persons, to prize individual's gifts without envy or resentment in a spirit of co-operation, to develop ownership in our college, to seek after excellence in all they are doing. If we can move away from the ranking of students and look at what they know rather than what

they don't know, there is a chance that we will move towards establishing the environment we want.

In looking back on the year, there are many people I would like to thank for the efforts they have made to enable the college to move along the path towards being an experience of the Good News. I thank the staff for their tremendous dedication and concern for the boys and the many ways in which they seek to show that. I thank parents for their support and the encouragement received in working in partnership with them. I thank the students for their willingness to be open to what is being tried and the hope they hold out for the future. After all, it is for them the college is run. I would thank the P.T.A. and the Board of Governors for their part in enabling the college to run smoothly.

In particular, I would like to thank Br Declan for the considerable contribution he has made to the college. As he leaves us to return to Australia, which he left in 1962, I believe there is nothing I, or anyone else, can say to adequately recognise what he has done. His obvious dedication to young people has been attested to by so many boys over those years and the way he has spent himself in the service of others is something of a legend. The boys here have been greatly blessed through their contact with Br Declan and on behalf of them all, I would express gratitude for a life given so freely and assure him of the prayerful remembrance of many young men who are richer for having known him.

In conclusion, may I wish you all the Lord's peace and joy during the coming Christmas season.



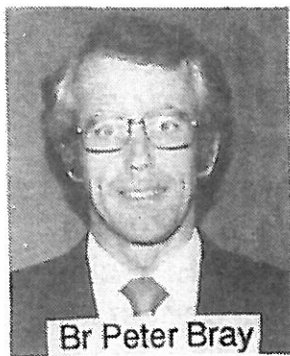

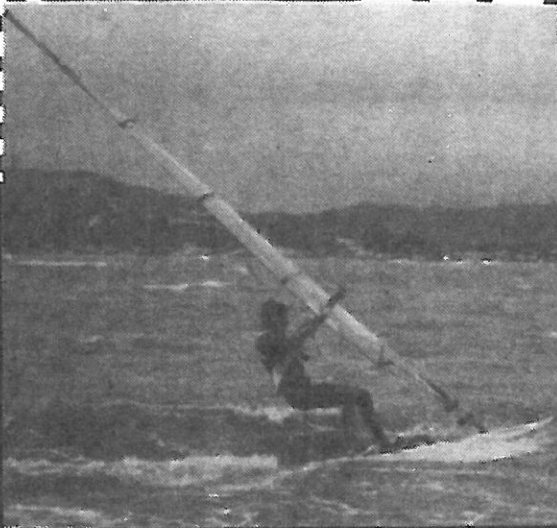


SOLOMON ISLANDS

The school's Solomon Islands relief project was organised by Benildus 4. The idea was first suggested during Vertical Form time and the class decided that something should be done to assist the people of the Solomon Islands which was struck by a hurricane earlier this year.

Thursday 5 June was arranged with Br Peter as a suitable date for a multi-day and various activities, including Vertical Form discussions, voluntary fasts, clothing and household utensil collections. Students were encouraged to bring along items such as clothing and household utensils rather than money. The day was a major success and members of Benildus 4 went around all the Vertical Forms collecting the donations. Over \$400 was collected along with a large amount of clothing, household items and other items. All the donations were later taken to Radio Taranaki where they were added to other items for forwarding to the Solomon Islands.

Bryce Hunger made an outstanding contribution while Blair Judd showed out. Stephen Iremonger and Wayne Bond were the most promising and improved players.



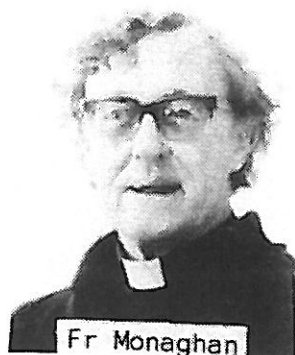

The Cadet Programme in 1986 has followed the pattern of earlier years with three days of school-based training in the first term, and a week long camp to be held at Rahotu during December. All fourth formers participate in cadets, and the N.C.O.'s are drawn from students in fifth, sixth and seventh form. The training programme includes drill, weapon training, range - shooting, firearms safety, orienteering and mapwork. Each platoon spent a morning learning fire-service procedures, and practical and leadership exercises are part of the camp programme.

Major L. Walsh retired from the position of Unit Commander at the beginning of the year, and the unit wishes to express its gratitude for the considerable time and effort he has given to the cadets, both in this unit and on annual camps. Nearly twenty years have passed since Mr Walsh appointed to his first commission. Br Adrian (Major Watson) has assumed the position of Unit Commander.

Robert Schumacher was awarded the Robert Friar Memorial Medal for best Under-Officer in the Central Region in 1985, continuing a proud tradition that the Unit has had

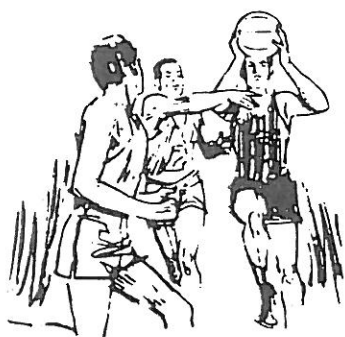
of gaining this award. Since 1963, the Unit has received the award seventeen times.
